Working Holiday Maker Visa Changes

The Working Holiday Maker Program has received fresh impetus from two recent Federal Government announcements.

Under the future Australia - United Kingdom Free Trade Agreement, Working Holiday Visa makers in the UK will get expanded rights. They will be able to stay for three years with an increased cut off age of 35.

The Federal Minister for Immigration announced upcoming changes to the Program will provide more support to the tourism and hospitality sectors.

WHM visa holders working in the tourism and hospitality sectors in Northern, remote and very remote areas of Australia will be able to count this as specified work, making them eligible for a second or third WHM visa.

This option will be available to WHMs who lodge their applications from March 2022 and will take into account work undertaken in the tourism and hospitality sectors in these areas from today.

As announced in October 2020, WHMs offshore who were unable to come to Australia or had to leave early because of COVID-19 will be able to apply for a replacement visa with nil Visa Application Charge (VAC) from 1 July 2021.




